I have been working my way through the homework assignments and have just started working on going through all of the exercises in the book *The C Programming Language*.

This is excellent!

I have been trying to figure out where I should be performing these exercises (i.e. writing out the code). Should I be doing this through a Jupyter Notebook in Python, in the visual studio space, or a different location?

In this class, we will start by working from the command line using emacs as a text/code editor. You will learn how to navigate the Linux filesystem, how to compile and run programs, etc.

Later we will move to using Visual Studio for debugging.

Then, eventually, we will use Python and at the very end of the course, introduce Python notebooks.

For now, you should log into ece-000 and use that account to work your homework problems. Create a directory in your home directory:

```
<login>
mkdir practice
cd practice
mkdir example_000
cd example_000
<do your work>
```
